Our concept for Spring Term is "Culture and Celebration" (Dathlu in Welsh). Please find the Topic Map which outlines our learning including pupil voice and Home Learning Menu uploaded to our Class Dojo page for children to explore and complete tasks from.

We would like to focus on Cymreig this term, meaning our own Welsh culture with an immersive Mari Lwyd day and start considering entries for our upcoming Eisteddfod. We will explore religious celebrations through art and music, discover how light and sound play a part in celebration, deep diving into a full investigation during Science Week, and consider culture through remembrance whilst learning about Wales during WW2.

Our Stay and Play session this term will be on Wednesday 25th February at 2pm where up to 2 adults are invited to attend to complete Welsh focussed activities with each child.

We will continue to have PE on a Tuesday; please can all children wear PE kit and appropriate trainers to school. During these colder months, please ensure children have coats and warm things to wear for outdoor learning and play times (labelled). Every child should have wellies or spare shoes available in school daily where possible.

Weekly spellings and times tables will be set on a Monday morning (extra accessed via Hwb, both in school and at home). These will be reviewed every Friday and you will find a mix of both English and Welsh language. Reading books should be changed regularly to promote progression and support our in school Guided Reading sessions. Miss S will continue to support our class with ELSA this term.

Parent/carer consultations will take place on Tuesday 24th and Wednesday 25th March in the school hall with the booking form made available on Dojo approx 1 week prior.

Class Dojo will be updated regularly with events, information and snippets of learning. If there are any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school and we will respond as soon as possible.
